<u>Charleston County Public Works</u>- Charleston County Council is mandating that Public Works enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with all municipalities that would include a budgetary allowance to provide routine maintenance for road and drainage systems with the understanding that the budgetary allowance will be the average annual amount of the cost of basic services over the prior four years. Work above the allowance or non-routine services will be reimbursed to the County at the full-burdened cost.
