II. Construction

Fire Station Structural Repairs- Applied Building Sciences has submitted the *Owner Review Drawings and Specifications* for review by the Town. The tentative schedule suggests that the documents be let for bid on March 6, 2019 with bids due on April 10, 2019. Attorneys Bundy and McDonald are reviewing the Owner GC AIA A-104 contact documents.

Toler's Cove Dredge Project- Engineers are awaiting final core samples and USACE permitting to commence channel and slip dredging at Toler's Cove. Dredge material will be deposited at site 106-35A (Sullivan's Island Spoil area)

Boardwalk Repair and Construction- Estimates have been provided for repairs to the boardwalks at Station 25 and 26 Streets along with new construction at the Sullivan's Island Elementary School. Funding can be accomplished through the General Fund, Greenbelt Fund and Hospitality Tax fund. The Greenbelt Fund grant money can only be used for new construction and is due by February 22, 2019.

Station 16 Street Nature Trail- The family of Adela Cook has requested to build a memorial bench at the seaward reflection deck on the Nature Trail.

Automated License Plate Recognition- Staff has received an offer from a group of residents willing to fund an ALPR. Discussions and due diligence continue.

III. Personnel

Robert Tennant: Probation period has been successfully completed by Officer Tennant and Chief Griffin is prepared to move the employee to full time status.

Carlos Hernandez-Officer Hernandez completed his twelve-week certification at the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy on February 8, 2019. He will continue his field training with senior members of the department command staff and Chief Griffin.

Rhett Beard- Submitted his letter of resignation to be effective February 15, 2019.

IV. General

South Carolina Department of Transportation- The SCDOT completed maintenance and work order crews on Sullivan's Island on 2-1-2019. Town maintenance work included a number of ditches and culverts, removal of unauthorized pipe, pavement striping and sink hole repair. SCDOT is prepared to begin design on replacement of stormwater pipe along Station 28 ½ Street between I'On Avenue and Jasper Boulevard. It has been determined that the outfall ownership belongs to the Town. Additionally, to install stormwater pipe from Atlantic Avenue to I'On Avenue would be for the account of the Town.

General Fund and Utility Budgets- Staff has commenced budget preparation meetings and discussions for the 2019-2020 budget process. Council is encouraged to prepare its list of capital requests.

General Assembly of South Carolina-Bills of interest for municipalities:

- S217 and H3132- provides the ability to use state and local accommodations and hospitality tax revenue to control and repair flooding and drainage in tourist-related areas. The Senate passed S217 and sent it to the House where it was referred to the House Ways and Means Committee.
- H3801- the legislation would disregard backflow prevention device manufacturers' recommendations for testing and allow testing one time in any five-year period.
- H3137- sponsored by a bipartisan group of House members, was introduced to change the LGF formula to a more predictable funding level from year to year. The House of Representatives passed H3137 and sent it to the Senate, where it was referred to the Senate Finance Committee.
- H3274- a bill that prohibits municipalities from enacting laws related to the ingredients, flavors or licensing of cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, tobacco products or nicotine products, was given second reading by a vote of 69-37 in the House. Rep. Alan Clemmons (R-Horry) proposed three amendments that would have exempted zoning ordinances from the pre-emption, however, all three amendments were defeated. This bill takes away the authority of cities and towns to protect local youth from harmful nicotine products. A companion bill to H3274 was introduced in the Senate, S492, and referred to the Senate Medical Affairs Committee.
