An Emergency Meeting of Town Council was held on the above date at approximately 9:00 a.m., all requirements of the Freedom of Information Act having been satisfied.

Mayor O’Neil called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and stated the press and public had been notified in accordance with State Law. There were no members of the public or media present. This meeting was conducted via virtual meeting as a result of COVID-19 Pandemic.

Discussion and Consideration of a motion to approve Emergency Ordinance 2020-04 (Attachment 1):

Mayor O’Neil stated that Emergency Ordinance 2020-04 is the same as Emergency Ordinance 2020-03 with following additions:

1. The ability of Council to remotely participate in voting and operational procedures by telephone or other means of electronic communication provided compliance with the provisions of the South Carolina Freedom of Information continues and shall be extended, when needed and appropriate, to all Town Boards and Commissions.
2. Access to Sullivan’s Island will be continue to be restricted through April 30, 2020, allowing access to only the following:
  - a) Residents of Sullivan’s Island with windshield sticker or proof of residency readily visible on the vehicle without the need for physical interaction with officers;
  - b) Service workers with business license or company identification;
  - c) Relatives and/or friends of residents only in presence of a current resident in a vehicle with windshield sticker or proof of residency readily visible on the vehicle without the need for physical interaction with officers;
  - d) Delivery personnel, including but not limited to pharmacy, Fedex, UPS, Amazon, USPS;
  - e) Any delivery of essential medical services, including caregivers;
  - f) Employees of local businesses, including but not limited to, restaurants, retail establishments, real estate firms.
  - g) Access will be restricted subject to the above from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
3. All other measures adopted in Ordinance 2020-03 shall remain in effect.
