


What are Design Standards?

Rules for how properties within locally-designated historic districts are treated. They are administered by the Town's Design Review Board (DRB), and they apply to the following types of work:

- Alterations to properties (landscapes and structures), including building additions
- Relocations or demolition of structures
- New development

Why are Design Standards Needed?

Since the existing districts were designated in 2003, the DRB has been utilizing federal standards that are generic, so more specificity is needed that is tailored to Sullivan's Island.



Goals for the Project:

- Create a user-friendly manual for use by property owners and the Sullivan's Island Design Review Board (DRB)
- Provide information on appropriate rehabilitation, new construction, and resilience
- Provide information on rehabilitation tax credits
- Provide a reference guide for additional sources of assistance






Design Guidelines Content







YES: Additions should be secondary in scale, recessed from the main façade, and sited at rear elevations. They should generally be designed in traditional wing or ell plans and be distinguished from the historic building.



YES: Driveways should connect with rear garages with a minimum of paving materials and visual impact.
