## Project Understanding & Approach

Proper planning is key to a successful project. By identifying known and unknown issues early, delays as well as other project and community-related impacts can be minimized. It is anticipated that this project will commence construction in January 2025 and be complete in March 2025. Storage of equipment and employee parking will be limited to the site and the adjacent Benke-Lowe Landing parking lot. Construction will be scheduled during non-peak boating season and use of the parking lot will have minimal impact to the public. Work will take place 8am-6pm Monday through Friday. Saturdays (10am-4pm) will be utilized when adverse weather conditions during the week prevent construction. We will provide notice to the Town and adjacent residents when the need to work Saturdays arises. Interference with the existing roadway traffic will be minimal with the occasional equipment and trucks entering and exiting the site. Below is a more detailed description of the Project including mobilization, demolition, and construction.

Our scope of work includes subcontracting a structural engineer to evaluate the existing wall for the new handrail attachment and an evaluation of the existing south wall along with the design of the Envirolok retaining wall. We have included the price for these evaluations, a cost for hand borings (to be performed by a geotechnical engineer), and an allowance to design structural plans for any structural repairs warranted. We will then price the repairs for approval and submit for permitting.

We are proposing an AIA form A101-2017, Standard Agreement as the contract form, with the allowance included, in the lump sum agreement.

#### Mobilization

Use of the site and walkway will be limited to construction personnel only and will be fenced off and secured daily with safety fence. During this phase, there will be minimal to no material and equipment stored. Employees will park at the adjacent Benke-Lowe Landing parking lot. Approximately five to seven spaces will be utilized for Gulf Stream's employee parking. A portable restroom will be installed and secured to prevent tipping. Survey stakeout, tree protection, and silt fence will be installed.

#### **Demolition**

Small equipment (mini excavator with grinder, skid steer, loader and flatbed truck) will mobilize to the site and initially park at the boat ramp until there is sufficient room to stage within the limits of disturbance (LOD) of the Project. The existing shrubs, bushes, and small trees will be ground on site with minimal earth disturbing and grubbing operations. Demolition of existing asphalt will take place with excess material being removed from the site and recycled at a local asphalt plant. The existing sign will be relocated. The existing bench and wooden structure on the wall face will be removed. Equipment will be stored within the Project's LOD. During the demolition and construction phases, we will need approximately five parking spaces for employee parking during the day and three spaces overnight and on weekends for fuel dispenser/tank, flatbed truck, and portable restroom.

### Construction

Demolition equipment will demobilize, and the Project will transition to the construction phase. Similar to the demolition phase, a mini excavator along with a skid steer and loader will be utilized. The site will be rough graded, cut, and filled in preparation for the Envirolok walls. Once the walls are complete, the site will be fine graded and dressed. Installation of the native plant material and landscaping will then commence. The Envirolok retaining wall will be hydroseeded with a native grass seed mix. Once landscaping is complete, the pervious walkway will be installed. Once the pervious walkway is complete, the handrails will be installed. The new bench seat will be installed as well as the cable rail system. Upon final stabilization, all tree protection and silt fence will be removed. The site will then re-open to the public.

# **Project Team**

During the procurement period, Gulf Stream's primary point of contact will be Mark Hylton, PE – President, who brings with him over 30 years of extensive experience in construction and engineering. Once awarded, the project will then turn over to Paul Capps, PE – Senior Project Manager and Pierce Parlier, PE – Project Manager who each have over 30 years and 6 years of experience, respectively, in construction and managing complex civil infrastructure projects.



# Site Management Plan

Gulf Stream intends to establish and maintain site security from the beginning to the completion of the project. Temporary fences and gates will be used at access points along public right of ways to control entering and exiting the project site. Security cameras will be utilized at laydown and equipment areas and monitored 24/7. Any and all excavations will be maintained safely to at minimum OSHA Standards.

## **Related Experience on Similar Projects**

With over 60 years of experience, Gulf Stream has a number of successful projects completed around the area. As it relates to the Old Trolley Bridge Renovations project, we have a vast amount of experience working in tight sites and adjacent to the water. Most notably the Low Battery Seawall repairs project we are constructing for the City of Charleston. We have completed Phases 1, 2, and 3, and are currently constructing Phase 4, which is on schedule to be complete in April 2025. This project includes the demolition of the existing wall and constructing a new seawall that is 2' taller to cope with sea level rise and storm surge. A reference letter from Frank Newham, Senior Project Manager with the City of Charleston, is provided with our submittal package.

After working with the City of Charleston for the past five years to replace the Low Battery Wall, we understand the importance of working with the adjacent residents and treating them as if they were our own neighbors. Our Project Safety Planning and Traffic Control includes not only our work, but also being mindful and sensitive to those that live and work around the project. We feel that communicating with the residents by means of Town Staff will help make them feel as if they are part of the team and help keep them abreast of our progress.

In addition to the Low Battery Seawall Repairs, Gulf Stream recently completed the Beresford Creek Bridge replacement on Daniel Island for the City. A very technical, complex, and environmentally sensitive project that had its host of challenges along the way.

Other projects completed in the area include the following:

- City Boatyard Site Modifications
- Hawk's Nest Park Hanahan
- Mount Pleasant Memorial Waterfront Park
- International African American Museum

In addition to a number of similar projects completed over the years, Gulf Stream was recently awarded the Pitt Street Bridge Improvements project with the Town of Mount Pleasant. This project has a number of similarities to the Old Trolley Bridge Renovation project, including the Envirolok Retaining Wall. We plan to utilize the same project team and carry their expertise from one side of the Intracoastal Waterway to the other.

## Experience and Projects with the Town of Sullivan's Island

Gulf Stream Construction has been working with the Town of Sullivan's Island for numerous years. Past projects include:

- J. Marshall Stith Park renovations and drainage improvements
- Benke-Lowe Landing boat ramp extension
- Emergency Access at Station 22
- Fish Fry Shack drainage improvements
- Station 25 kayak launch access and turnaround

#### **Quality Management Plan**

Upon notice to proceed, Gulf Stream's licensed survey professional will develop a 3D-model of the project in house. This helps to identify potential design or constructability issues ahead of time. Once the 3D-model is complete, we will be able to transmit this data to the field where our crews will have a hand-held data collector that shows the project model in 3D. The equipment is checked daily to ensure the data (GPS/UTS) is within acceptable tolerances.

Upon completion of an item, the GPS/surveying field crew checks and verifies the alignment and grades are within acceptable project specifications. Third party registered and licensed land surveyors are utilized to establish project



control, stake out underground utilities, and provide final as-builts. Gulf Stream Construction will employ a full-time field engineer/project manager to administer the quality control program. This program will incorporate the project's submittal procedures and all minimum testing and sampling project requirements.

## **Project Schedule**

Gulf Stream plans to hold weekly meetings with the Town and project Engineer. Discussion topics will include schedule review, clarifications/RFI's, inspections, safety, quality control, and erosion control. Gulf Stream will hold separate weekly meetings with our internal team, subcontractors, and suppliers. Gulf Stream will comply with all project specifications regarding communications between parties, submittals, schedule requirements, etc.

We utilize state-of-the-art management and scheduling software packages that accurately create the project schedule along with providing construction resource assignments, progress tracking of specific tasks / subtasks and milestones. plus workload analysis and critical path identification. Below is a schedule of the Project's milestones. On the following pages, you will find the detailed project schedule.

- Award: October 18, 2024
- Preconstruction Phase: October 18, 2024 January 10, 2025
  - Structural design, permitting, submittals, and procurement
- Construction Phase: December 16, 2024 to March 25, 2025
  - Staking, mobilization, SWPPP install, demolition, and construction
- Project Completion: March 25, 2025

## **Project Budget**

Our budget management protocols include but are not limited to clearly identifying owner's goals and expectations, ensuring requirements of project are accurately identified, factoring in potential external variables, completely vetting suppliers and vendors, internal establishment and monitoring of key performance indicators, review and re-forecast of budget oversight, and clear communication with team regarding status and accountability.

- Price is based on striping 6 inches of topsoil. No geotechnical report was provided, so if additional striping is required additional cost to be to be negotiated based on quantities.
- No Undercut/Recompaction of existing in situ subgrade is included. Compaction of existing subgrade only.
- All soils are presumed suitable for use as fill, backfill and structural fill. If additional borrow is needed to replace onsite soils (considered unsuitable). Additional cost to be negotiated based on quantities needed.
- Soils are predicted to be fairly high in moisture content. We have included disking as a means of drying these soils. Pricing is based on a 2 day drying time for placing on site material. Due to the sensitive nature of these soils and their reaction to weather conditions (which is beyond our control), if additional means of drying and/or stabilization is required, additional cost to be negotiated based on requirements provide by Geotechnical Engineer.
- No removal or relocation of underground or overhead utilities, lines, cables or power poles.
- Erosion control devices are to be installed as shown on drawings. However, the overall pollution prevention plan is dependent on site & weather conditions which are beyond the contractor's control. The conditions of this Bond are such that if the Owner accepts the bid of the Contractor within the time specified in the bid documents, or within such time period as may be agreed to by the Owner and Contractor, and the Contractor either (1) enters into a contract with the Owner in accordance with the terms of such bid, and gives such bond or bonds as may be specified in the bidding or Contract Documents, with a surety admitted in the jurisdiction of the Project and otherwise acceptable to the Owner, for the faithful performance of such Contract and for the prompt payment of labor and material furnished in the prosecution thereof; or (2) pays to the Owner the difference, not to exceed the amount of this Bond, between the amount specified in said bid and such larger amount for which the Owner may in good faith contract with another party to perform the work covered by said bid, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect. The Surety hereby waives any notice of an agreement between the Owner and Contractor to extend the time in which the Owner may accept the bid. Waiver of notice by the Surety shall not apply to any extension exceeding sixty (60) days in the aggregate beyond the time for acceptance of bids specified in the bid documents, and the Owner and Contractor shall obtain the Surety's consent for an extension beyond sixty (60) days.
