THE OFFICER'S CLUB


Jasper Hall is located at 1735 Atlantic Avenue at the southern end of Sullivan's Island. The building was constructed in 1933 as a recreational club for Fort Moultrie's senior officers, and has had multiple phases of construction on the site since that time. The approximately two acre, oceanfront site is bonded by a very active public beach access to the west, an inactive public beach access (cut off from the street by a retention pond) to the east, a heavily wooded dune on the beach frontage, and Atlantic Avenue to the north.

At the time of its construction, the building sat by itself on the beach, but over time ,since the decommissioning of the fort, the land to either side and across Atlantic Avenue has been subdivided and infilled with single-family residential homes. Jasper HAll itself was sold to SCE&G after the decommissioning, and converted into the Sand Dunes Beach Club, a semi-private establishment for SCE&G employees and local Sullivan's Island residents. Closure of the beach club and recent zoning actions necessitate that the building convert to a single-family residence, Charting a path for the building's next phase of life for a new generation of Sullivan's Island residents.





APARTMENT AND STORAGE

The basement level of Jasper Hall is largely unconditioned space. A series of concrete spread footings and CMU foundation walls support heavy timber structural members on which the upper structure is built. During the period that they owned the building SCE&G completed significant structural reinforcing throughout the basement, including adding steel pipe columns in several places.

While most of the basement is unfinished, there is a space towards the beach side of the basement that was historically finished as a keeper's, or caretaker's apartment, and then later converted to a card room when the building operated as the Sand Dunes Beach Club. Infilled framing visible from underneath implies where the probable location of the original stair to access the apartment was located. A portion of the basement is also finished as a storage area, with shelving and a solid floor.



EVENTS AND SERVICES

The main level of Jasper Hall is dedicated to hosting large events. Three event halls, the historic main hall, and two smaller halls, are supported by a nuber of service spaces including a commercial kitchen, serving window, offices, numerouos restrooms, storage, and large mechanical rooms. Arrayed around the Atlantic Avenue facades are a series of large elevated HVAC units that obstruct the view of the facades. Covered porches run along the beach side of the building, with a large paved courtyard area between the masses of the building.



ROOF STRUCTURE

The roof of the building is a complex collection of hips and gables that appear haphazard in places, due to the multiple additions that have been made to the structure over the years, producing a number of unique roof connections. The porch roofs in particular appear to have been attached in ways that covered many of the architectural details of the building on the beach facing frontage. There is some evidence of water damage in places on the interior, so a careful evaluation of the roof structure will be required.







BEACH RECREATION

In 1926 Jasper Pavilion, the first construction on the site, was built on recently accrued beach in front of the Senior Officers Residences. The Pavilion was intended to be a recreation facility for all ranks of the fort, and included facilities for "surf-bathing", an open-air movie theater, and a dance hall with a massive stone fireplace. In April of 1932 the facility was destroyed in a fire, with only the stone fireplace left standing. This is the same fireplace around which Jasper Hall would be built in 1933, and still stands in the main hall today.





PHASES OF CONSTRUCTION

After the loss of Jasper Pavilion to fire in 1932, the fort leadership moved quickly to rebuild the new larger, more elaborate Jasper Hall in the same location, even using the stone fireplace as a central feature in the new construction. Over the course of it's lifetime as first the Senior Officers Club, then a general recreation building for the fort, and then a private beach club owned by SCE&G, the building has had distinct phases of new additions and renovations.

– 1933 —

The original construction consisted of the main hall, with support spaces at either end of the building. The 1933 construction was highly detailed, and intended as a complimentary structure to the Senior Officers Residences that it was sited in front of, with their distinct Island Beach Cottage architecture.

— 1939 –

The fort expanded Jasper Hall with a two-story addition to increase the functionality of the building with a second, smaller, hall, a card room, dressing rooms, a lower level caretaker's apartment, and additional support spaces.

– 1947 –

Fort Moultrie is decommissioned.

– 1950 –


SCE&G purchases Jasper Hall and begins operating it as a semi-private beach club for SCE&G employees and Sullivan's Island residents. The building was renamed the Sand Dunes Beach Club at this time. The building operated for approximately 10 years with only minor additions, such as an elevated swimming pool.

- c.1960 —

SCE&G undertook a massive renovation of the building in order to solve some functional needs, such as an elevated entrance (flooding), providing shade on the porches, and minimizing maintenance with new materials such as asbestos siding. Unfortunately the building lost much of its historic architectural character at this time.



A LANDMARK FACILITY

FMMR's officer leadership directed that the Post Quartermasters construct a new officer's club in 1933. Selecting a location that would be secluded from FMMR's lower ranking soldiers to maintain its military hierarchy, the Post Quartermasters revisited the site of the burned Jasper Pavilion on the beach in front of the senior officer's quarters. The new building matched the senior officer's early 20th century classical residential style, which came to be known as Island Beach Cottage architecture. Jasper Hall, the name given to the new officer's club, became the central entertainment area for the post's leaders. Due to its importance to FMMR's officer leadership, Jasper Hall was constructed as one of the post's most handsome structures. Not constructed from a standard U.S. Army Quartermaster plan, it received more attention to the building materials used and craftsmanship, to create a significant addition to the post's overall layout.



LIGHT AND VIEWS

The new Jasper Hall was designed to take full advantage of its prominent location on the beach. Large windows, reaching a height of 13+ feet let light and air into the building on all sides. Several sets of double doors with large windows above opened onto the open porch that fronted the ocean. Over time this view, a character defining feature of the building, would be lost as the dunescape continued to accrue and vegetation covered much of the area between the building and the water. Today the beach is significantly further from the building that when the building was constructed.

The intended relationship between the Senior Officers Residences and Jasper Hall has become less distinct over time as new residential infill has occupied the spaces between and around the historic Fort Moultrie structures. At its construction in 1933, officers would have been able to appreciate the formal facade of the Officer;s Club from the porches of their residences, with the ocean serving as the backdrop to the building's architecture.





CLASSICAL ROOTS

The original Jasper Hall entrance facade made prominent use of a Palladian (also Venetian or Serlian) window above an open arcade as its primary architectural expression. The use of this motif for a military officers building was likely intentional, as the Palladian design was originally inspired by Roman triumphal arches commonly erected to celebrate military victories. It's use was popularized in the 16th century by Andrea Palladio, and by the 20th century had become a staple of grand classical architecture.




1739 Plate of a Palladian, or Venetian, window.





ARRIVING AT JASPER HALL

The original arrival experience at the Officers Club brought visitors into the building through a ground level covered drop-off that led into a lower level lobby. The upscale nature of the building is evident in the historic photos of elaborate wall art and mirrored niches in the entry foyer, which contained a stair that took patrons up to the main club level. The vehicle entrance and exit to the drop-off was adorned with large half-circle scalloped medallions with crossed rifles in their center, the primary insignia for the U.S. Army's Infantry branch. Unfortunately this area was also prone to flooding due to the low grade level, as the historic photos illustrate.


NEW SPACES AND SERVICES

In 1939, the post leadership approved an expansion to Jasper Hall to add additional functionality and to create a caretaker's apartment in the building, so that the facility had a full-time staff. The two-story addition as added to the east end of the main hall and significantly expanded the capacity of the facility at a time when the base personnel population was expanding rapidly due to the build up prior to World War II.

According to the military's Property Record Card for Jasper Hall:

"Addition of play rm., 40' x 34'; 2 bedrooms, 14'8" x 8'5" & 9'4" x 12"6"; 2 living rooms 9'10" x 14'8" and 9'4" x 12'6"; 2 bath rooms 6"2" x 7'10" and 6'8" x 6'3" all in basement;

Main floor card room 22' 11"; dressing rm. 10' x 7' 4"; bath 10' x 5' 1"; ladies dress. rm. 10' x 7' 4"; bath 10' x 5' 1"; porch 93' x 12'; 22 radiators."





APARTMENT AND CARD ROOM

A unique feature of the 1939 additions was the inclusion of finished lower level spaces. As the base was growing and Jasper Hall was expanding and experiencing more use, full-time management of the facility became necessary. To that end, the addition included living spaces in the ground floor for a caretaker to live on site. Later renovations converted this space to a card room for patrons, and then it was eventually gutted to add structural reinforcing, but the vestiges of its prior use still appear. The apartment's brick fireplace remains, as does fragments of decorative wall trim still attached to the structure's beams and joists. An original shower and plumbing connections are still visible. There is even evidence of where the original stair down to the apartment was closed in the ceiling framing. A series of wall murals give life to the space even today.



DECOMMISSIONING & RENOVATION

After the decommissioning of Fort Moultrie in 1947, Jasper Hall was purchased by SCE&G for use as a amenity for their employees and renamed the Sand Dunes Beach Club. The club operated largely as-is for many years, until circa 1960, when SCE&G undertook a massive re-imaging of the building. This was done primarily for functional reasons: the ground level entrance was prone to flooding, the clapboard wood siding was hard to maintain in the salt environment, the open porches were hot and needed to be shaded, the original single-pane windows were inefficient and made heating and cooling the large interior spaces difficult, and additional service and mechanical spaces were needed in the interior that did not need large windows in them.

Unfortunately, the renovations were not done with an eye towards preserving the architectural detail of the 1933 construction, and much of the historic character of the original Jasper Hall was lost at this time. The entire exterior was stripped and replaced, with the exception of the classical corner pilasters. Asbestos siding and flush nail-flange windows were added, and many windows closed altogether. The new roofs over the porches covered much of the historic cornice and eave, and cut off the upper windows of the main hall from light and views. The primary facade was dramatically altered with a new portico and stair, and the Palladian motif of the facade was lost completely.







ARCHITECTURAL CHARACTER

SCE&G altered the architectural character of Jasper Hall to such a degree that The Town of Sullivan's Island Historic Resources Report, published in 2024, characterizes the building as ineligible for National Register of Historic Places listing under Criterion C: Design/Construction. While the building is eligible under Criterion A: Event (being a part of the historic context of the events of Fort Moultrie), the alterations done by SCE&G were so extensive that the building has lost the basic architectural integrity of its original

Given that the intent of the original design is well known to have been tied to the motivations and preferences of the senior officer leadership of Fort Moultrie, and the desire for the building to be a complement to the officer's row of homes, an opportunity exists to now restore the architectural character of this landmark structure, while also achieving the functional changes that SCE&G rightly identified as necessary for the successful reuse of the building. By studying the full architectural history of Jasper Hall, and learning from great examples of the Island Beach Cottage architecture, particularly the Senior Officers Residences, we can formulate design strategies and architectural details that are compatible with the building's history and historic architectural context of the neighborhood.




RENOVATION MASTER PLAN

The Fort Moultrie Officer's Club, historically Jasper Hall, has been a landmark on Sullivan's Island since the early 1930's. Designed to be a grand building that would rival the recreational facilities at Fort Sumter, the island cottage classicism of the building was a point of pride that deviated from the standard military Quartermaster Plans and was intended to coordinate with the architecture of the nearby Officer's Residences.

Unfortunately, much of this historic character was lost during a mid-century renovation undertaken by SCE&G, who purchased the building to use as a beach club for employees after the fort was decommissioned. The entire exterior of the building, with the exception of the corner pilasters, was replaced, porches were covered with sloped roofs, all of the windows were replaced, and many closed in, a brick water table was added to the base of the building, and a new portico and stair was built that covered the building's historic porte cochere and main palladian window. As a result, the building today bears little resemblance, outside of its general massing, to the historic structure of the 1930s.

As the building enters its third phase of life, as a grand residence, the opportunity exists to restore the architecture of the original 1930's design to the building, while addressing functional issues that SCE&G got right in their renovation, such as the need for shaded porches and a main entrance that was out of the flood plain. Residential features, such as a new garage, recreation pavilion, and pool house, extend the architecture of the main building into the two-acre site, and frame a terraced site plan that works with the topography and includes a formal pool terrace, open lawns, a turfgrass play area, sitting arbor, and naturalized wet and dry water retention areas, all with convenient access to the beach.


PROPOSED PALLADIAN FACADE



WEST ELEVATION



On the east facade of the building, the renovation plan is focused on restoring historic window openings that were closed up during the SCE7G renovation, and restoring decorative pilasters that were removed, but evidence of them still remains in the frieze band at the eave of the building. A new brick watertable creates a solid base for the building, and helps to manage the grade transition along the side of the building. Secondary entrance porches for service and guests are added in the corners, where porches historically were located, and an existing metal service door to the basement is replaced with a panel door that can provide access to open air storage for sports equipment and kayaks under the building. Existing elevated HVAC platforms and screens are removed and equipment is relocated to more concealed areas of the building and site.




EAST ELEVATION



As new residential infill and dune landscape accrued in front of the Senior Officers Residences, the historic view of the ocean that these landmark structures had was lost, much the same as the historic view from Jasper Hall. A common architectural pattern emerged to reclaim the historic viewshed; adding "widow's walk" porches above the roofline of the second story porch. The renovation design for Jasper Hall proposes to use the same strategy, as well as porch details that are compatible with the island beach cottage style that is typical of the early 20th century Fort Moultrie buildings.



Seven of the twelve homes of the Senior Officers Residences have used widows walk porches in some fashion to reclaim the historic viewshed.




