MCL = Maximum Contaminant Level: The highest level of a contaminant allowed in drinking water.

MCL's are set as close to the MCLG's as feasible using best available treatment technology. ppm = Parts Per Million

MCLG = Maximum Contaminant Level Goal: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLG's allow for a margin of safety.

AL = Action Level: The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

LRAA = Locational Running Annual Average

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level: The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evide nce that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants. MRDLG = Maximum Residual

ppb = Parts Per Billion Disinfectant Level Goal: The level of a drinking water

disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not

Sullivans Island is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the varity of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your drinking water, you may wish to have your water tested.
